MORE LIKE JESUS

As I'm sure you're well aware, yesterday was Valentine's Day. How could you miss it? The stores were filled with red and pink balloons, heart-shaped candies, stuffed animals and cards to "show your love to others." I'm sure you've heard it said that "Valentine's Day is a Hallmark holiday"... meaning the company is said to have made up the holiday as a way to make more money by selling cards and gifts. You can find countless things on the internet supporting and also debunking this idea, but it's true that the holiday has been completely commercialized. Regardless, underneath it all is the indication that people want to feel loved. They want to give love, and they want to receive love. Which makes complete sense since God created life to actually operate on LOVE. But is the Valentine's Day type of love - giving gifts and expecting them in return - what true love is all about?

Our understanding of love is complex and often incorrect. We say we "love" pizza. A child may view their parent's unwillingness to give into their every want as them being "unloving." We see hurt and heartbreak in relationships and wonder if "love" is really all that great. But what is the Biblical understanding of love and does it line up with our own understanding of who God is when the Bible says "God IS love" (1 John 4:8, 16)?

First Corinthians 13 talks in great depth about what love is and what love is not. Within the many listed descriptions is the concept that love is a principle of selfless giving for the health and benefit of others. Dr. Timothy Jennings, Psychiatrist and President of Come & Reason Ministries, describes what love looks like in reality in his blog, "Loving Others - What Does It Look Like?" (https://comeandreason.com/loving-others-looks-like/)

"To love others means that we seek to do what is in their best interest, even when they might want something else. In order to do this, we must not only have loving concern for the other person, but we also must understand God's design laws, how reality works, what the problem is—and then, when appropriate, use our ability to act in harmony with God's design laws to bring healing influence to others... Love does what is right, healthy, and reasonable—in harmony with God's designs because it is right, healthy, and reasonable. Love doesn't do what others think seems right, but what is actually right, even if it is painful at the time. We are only able to do this as we come into unity with God, keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, and understand God's design laws for life."

The supporting Scripture for this year's school theme implores us to "Model yourselves after God and live your life in love." (Ephesians 5:1-2, The Remedy). We can be more like Jesus when, in love, we do what is right and best for others.
