## STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES



In 4th-5th grade we talked about what a role model is and things that a good role model does. Students got the opportunity to separate action and behavior cards based on what a good role model would and wouldn't do. Students then crumpled up and threw away the actions and behaviors that a good role model wouldn't do symbolizing that we don't want to practice those actions and behaviors.

In 6th-8th grade students were challenged with a frustrating puzzle type activity where they were not allowed to talk or communicate in any way - including nonverbal communication like pointing. Groups then discussed the activity and shared how they would connect it to their life. Responses included: "Being observant and seeing when someone needs help", "Don't yell especially if they are trying...if you have more materials than others, look to see if they need it", "Don't talk in class, work together even if the people you are working with are not your first pick", and "Life is one big puzzle that needs to be solved. Teamwork always makes the dream work."
